



- Algiers:** Commercial/residential/industrial mix.
- Algiers Point:** Quaint, historical, older homes.
- Broadmoor:** Projects on low ground. Was badly flooded; some houses being rebuilt on stilts.
- Bywater:** Bohemian artists, creoles, and gangs.
- Carrollton:** “College town” for Tulane & Loyola.
- CBD (Central Business District):** “Downtown.” Banks, businesses, city hall, consulates, etc.
- Central City:** Predominantly black area with brass street bands and a lot of violence.
- Esplanade Ridge:** Low-to-upper class homes.
- (Faubourg) Marigny:** Hip and trendy. Most locals hang out here instead of the French Quarter.
- French Quarter:** What you think of when you think “New Orleans.” Bourbon street, bars, beads.
- Garden District:** Mansions and the rich – beautiful.
- Gretna:** Malls, suburbs, schools. Not technically part of NOLA, but may as well be “Algiers West.”
- Irish Channel:** Poor working class; dockworkers.
- Lower Garden District:** A.K.A. the “Warehouse District.” A mix of docks, industry, and tourism.
- Mid-City:** Middle-class residential; few tourists.
- Parkview:** Lovely, scenic, middle/upper-class residential. City Park (huge!) is directly north.
- Treme:** A dangerous area slowly being gentrified to a cultural mecca. Gangs, churches, museums.
- Uptown:** Unique restaurants, shops, galleries, clubs, etc., plus two colleges and Audobon Park/Zoo.
